# Final Round Judges

## **Kashmira Date, MD, MPH**

*Johnson & Johnson*

Dr. Kashmira Date is the Global Medical/Scientific Affairs Lead with Global Health Equity, Johnson and Johnson (J & J). She is an accomplished global health leader with over 20 years of experience and expertise in infectious diseases and vaccines research, immunization programs and policies, epidemiology, real-world evidence, women's health and gender equity. A physician and an alumnus of CDC's distinguished Epidemic Intelligence Service program, she led CDC's work on cholera and typhoid vaccines for over 10 years, led a team on CDC's COVID-19 response and has won prestigious awards, including the Presidential Early Career Award for Scientists and Engineers under the Obama Administration, Woman of the Year in Science (2022) — Women in Technology and was selected for the inaugural cohort of WomenLift Health Leadership journey.



## **Phil Jacobs**

*Pendleton Consulting*

Mr. Jacobs is a founding Partner in The Pendleton Consulting Group and a Senior Consultant for Coxe Curry and Associates. Mr. Jacobs served in numerous leadership positions over a 34-year career at BellSouth and AT&T. He was named Chief Operating Officer of Optus Communications, a \$3 billion local, long distance and wireless firm headquartered in Australia. He has served on many Boards, including the United Way of Metropolitan Atlanta, Georgia Partnership for Excellence in Education, the High Museum of Art, Georgia Health Sciences Foundation of the Medical College of Georgia, the Tour de Georgia Foundation, Georgia Center for Advanced Telecommunications Technologies, Atlanta Neighborhood Development Partnership, Smart Start Georgia, and the Governor's Task Force on Tourism. Mr. Jacobs also served on the founding Board of the Georgia Leadership Institute for School Improvement. In addition, U.S. CDC dedicated the "Phil S. Jacobs Distance Learning Conference Center" in recognition of his work with the U.S. Congress to improve building and facilities funding for the agency.



## **Susan Maloney, MD, MHSc**

*Centers for Disease Control and Prevention*

Dr. Susan Maloney is the Senior Advisor for Tuberculosis in the Division of Global HIV and TB, U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), responsible for leading efforts to maximize CDC's impact on U.S. and global TB efforts by advancing research and programmatic activities across the agency. During her 25-year tenure at CDC, Dr. Maloney has also served as the Chief of the Global Tuberculosis Branch, Director of the International Emerging Infections Program, Thailand MOPH-US CDC Collaboration, and Director of CDC's Southeast Asia Regional Global Disease Detection Center (Thailand), and as Chief of the Immigrant, Refugee and Migrant Health Branch in CDC's Division of Global Migration and Quarantine. Dr. Maloney holds an MD from the Jacobs School of Medicine and Biomedical Sciences at the University at Buffalo, completed a Pediatrics Residency at Johns Hopkins University Hospital, a Pediatric Infectious Diseases Fellowship at the Children's National Medical Center, Washington, D.C., and is board certified in Pediatrics and Pediatric Infectious Diseases. She is a graduate of the CDC's Epidemic Intelligence Service (EIS) fellowship, earned a MHSc in Public Health Policy and Management from Johns Hopkins University School of Hygiene and Public Health and is a retired Captain in the USPHS.

**Pricilla Pemu, MD, MS, FACP**  
*Morehouse School of Medicine*

Priscilla Pemu is a Medical Doctor specializing in the care of adults with complex medical problems under treatment in clinic and hospital settings. She also trains medical students and new medical doctors specializing in Internal Medicine. As a physician-scientist, she leads research funded with grants from the National Institutes of Health and the American Heart Association, informed by her daily experiences with patients. She's continuously inspired to investigate the best ways to improve the long-term health of patients living with chronic illnesses, including cancer and diabetes. Dr. Pemu is currently a Professor of Clinical Medicine, Medical Director of the Clinical Research Center and Vice Chair for Research in the Department of Medicine at Morehouse School of Medicine (MSM) in Atlanta, GA. Dr. Pemu continues to explore and implement key patient-centered concepts that are relevant to improving health outcomes and transforming health care. She's passionate about speaking to audiences such as health care managers and funders, affected patient groups, health coaches and other scientists who are interested in achieving that shared goal.

**Robert James (RJ) Simonds, MD**  
*Global Health Leader (Retired U.S. CDC)*

RJ Simonds retired in 2021 after a 31-year career as a medical epidemiologist at the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Elizabeth Glaser Pediatric AIDS Foundation (EGPAF), with a focus on HIV and global health. Dr. Simonds made contributions to epidemiologic and implementation research, program design and implementation, strategic planning, change management, technical policy development, governmental and NGO leadership and management, training and mentorship, and health diplomacy. He held senior leadership positions at U.S. President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (Deputy Principal), CDC headquarters (Deputy Division Director), CDC Country Office Director in China, and EGPAF (Vice President).
